**Dear Friends,**

**One of the joys of preparing an annual report is that it gives us a chance to look back and to be thankful for all that has been accomplished. The past year was filled with both opportunities and challenges. Some highlights were:**

- **Led a coalition of more than 75 public, private and nonprofit organizations from across the state around a shared children's agenda called the Blueprint for Kentucky's Children.**
- **Coordinated the state KIDS COUNT Project, including product publication, regional forums, and briefings for state and federal elected leaders.**
- **Mobilized a record-breaking 1,300 youth and adults in Frankfort for Children's Advocacy Day at the Capitol to ask legislators to invest in children's health and well-being.**
- **Completed the first-ever study of school health services offered by school districts around the state.**
- **Coordinated efforts to improve physical activity in schools and make it easier and safer for students to walk or bike to school.**
- **Managed the Race, Community and Child Welfare Project which seeks to reduce the overrepresentation of youth of color in out-of-home care due to abuse or neglect in nine targeted communities in Kentucky.**
- **Launched a new website called *Sorting through the Smoke*, a resource targeting rural journalists across the state to build their capacity to cover the high rates of tobacco usage in their communities.**

- Actively engaged members of Kentucky’s federal delegation on issues relevant to children and youth such as juvenile justice, health care reform, and child nutrition.
- Organized efforts to launch a statewide initiative to connect low-income Kentucky families with assets for which they are eligible such as nutrition assistance, tax credits, health insurance, and child care subsidies.
