What is Children's Advocacy Day at the Capitol?

Each year Kentucky's community of child advocates sponsor an opportunity for children, youth and their advocates from across the state to be heard at the state capitol. Children's Advocacy Day at the Capitol began 6 years ago as an effort to unite advocates from across the state to raise their voices together on behalf of children's and families' safety, health, education and economic well-being.
