<b>PRIMARY</b> <a href="#">HB 381</a> Payday Lending	Caps the interest rates that payday lenders can charge at 36% APR <i>See <a href="#">Payday Lending Fact Sheet</a>*</i> <i>See report: <a href="#">A Cycle of Debt</a>*</i>	Rep. Darryl Owens	This bill was sent to but not called before the House Banking and Insurance Committee.

## Fair Opportunity for Every Child

Bill	Description	Sponsor	Summary
<b>PRIMARY</b>	<a href="#">HB 190</a> Early Childhood	Rep. Carl Rollins	This bill passed the House 99-0 on March 3, but failed to pass the Senate.
	<a href="#">HB 301</a> Graduation Rate	Rep. Jeff Greer	HB 301 passed the House on a vote of 94-6 on March 4. It also passed the Senate Education Committee 10-2, but Senate leadership did not call it for a vote on the House floor. Governor Beshear is considering adding it to the agenda for the upcoming special session.
<b>SECONDARY</b>	<a href="#">HB 194</a> Child Welfare	Rep. Tom Burch	This bill was sent to the House Judiciary Committee and did not pass.
	<a href="#">HB 412</a> Alternative Schools	Rep. Joni Jenkins	Progress on this bill halted when an unrelated amendment was tacked onto it. Governor Beshear is considering adding it to the agenda for the upcoming special session.

Bill	Description	Sponsor	Summary
PRIMARY	<a href="#">HB 52</a> Child Wellness	Rep. Addia Wuchner	A similar bill filed by Rep. Linda Belcher received a hearing in the House Education Committee, but failed a committee vote.
	<a href="#">HB 469</a> Child Health	Rep. Joni Jenkins	Sent to the Health & Welfare Committee, and did not pass.
SECONDARY	<a href="#">HB 43</a> Child Safety	Rep. Jody Richards	A Senate version of this bill passed both chambers and was signed into law by Governor Beshear on April 12.
	<a href="#">SB 86</a> Menu Labeling	Sen. Denise Harper-Angel	This bill did not pass but recent Health Care Reform measures that passed at the Federal level enact this provision for all 50 states.
	<a href="#">HB 246</a> Menu Labeling	Rep. Kelly Flood	This bill did not pass but recent Health Care Reform measures that passed at the Federal level enact this provision for all 50 states.
	<a href="#">HB 285</a> Child Safety	Rep. Addia Wuchner	Passed both chambers and awaiting Governor Beshear's signature.
	<a href="#">HB 375</a> KCHIP	Rep. David Watkins	Provisions were included in House Budget Proposal (original bill withdrawn from House). The session adjourned without legislators coming to agreement on a budget, therefore the Governor is calling them back for a special session in May. The final budget could still retain this provision.
